



DECR chairman sends congratulations to Primate of Church of Cyprus on occasion of 40th anniversary of his episcopal consecration

The Chairman of the Moscow Patriarchate's department for external church relations (DECR), Metropolitan Hilarion of Volokolamsk has congratulated His Beatitude Chrysostomos, Archbishop of New Justiniana and All Cyprus, on the fortieth anniversary of his archpastoral ministry. The message read:

I respectfully extend to you my wholehearted congratulations on the date so significant for the Orthodox Church of Cyprus – the 40th anniversary of your episcopal consecration.

Four decades ago, you were called by Divine Providence *to equip His people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up* (Eph. 4:12).
