



Primate of the Russian Orthodox Church greets heads of foreign states with Christmas and New Year

To mark the feast of the Nativity of Christ and the New Year, His Holiness Patriarch Kirill of Moscow and All Russia sent greetings to the heads of the foreign countries belonging to the Orthodox tradition. His Holiness congratulated President of Bulgaria Rumen Radev, President of Greece Prokopios Pavlopoulos, President of Cyprus Nicos Anastasiades, President of Macedonia Gjorge Ivanov, and President of Serbia Aleksandar Vučić. The text of the message is given below.
