

Meeting is held for the preparation of events marking the millennium of the demise of Holy Prince Vladimir and the Day of Slavonic Literature and Culture in 2015

On 20 March 2015, a meeting was held at the House of the Government of the Russian Federation, dedicated to the preparation of events marking the millennium of the demise of the Holy Right-Believing Prince Vladimir the Baptizer of Russia and the celebration of the Day of Slavonic Literature and Culture in 2015. The meeting was chaired by Ms. Olga Golodets, Deputy Chair of the Government of the Russian Federation.
