



Russian Orthodox Mission head's Name-Day celebrated in Jerusalem

On February 17, 2011, the commemoration day of St. Isidore Pelousiotes, the patron saint of the head of the Russian Orthodox Mission in Jerusalem, Archimandrite Isidor Minaev, a thanksgiving was celebrated at the church of the Holy Martyr Empress Alexandra.

Among the congregation were Bishop Agapit of Stuttgart, Russian Church Outside Russia, the clergy of the Mission, Sister Georgia, abbess of the Gorneye Convent, with sisters, sisters of the Gethsemane Convent of St. Mary Magdalene and monastery workers and parishioners, the official website of the Russian Orthodox Mission in Jerusalem has reported.

He presented Hieromonk Innokenty Bespalov with the Order of St. Seraphim accorded him by Patriarch Kirill of Moscow and Russia in recognition of his zealous work in the Holy Land and on the occasion of his 50th birthday.
