



Russian Church representative attends concert commemorating the 80th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Russia and Syria



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On July 13, a concert dedicated to the 80th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Russia and Syria was given at the Russian House in Damascus by the instrumental ensemble of the school at the Saydnaya convent. The event was organized in conjunction with the Syrian branch of the Imperial Orthodox Palestine Society and its head Michel At-Telli.

The anthems of the Syrian Arab Republic and the Russian Federation were performed before the concert. Bishop Moses of Larisa addressed the guests with a welcoming speech.
